Walk Worthy | Put On The New Self

Icebreaker: Was there a time in your life when you chose to put yourself out there as a different kind of person? What did you change? Was it easy or hard to change?

In this session, we will consider how Jesus changes everything in our lives, including how we relate to each other.

Read Ephesians 4:17-24

Paul is speaking to a Gentile audience, but he also recognizes that Gentiles are, by nature, separated from the people of God.

- How are Gentiles described in verses 17–19?
 - Do any of these characteristics resonate with your experience before getting to know Jesus?
 - o How do you see this demonstrated in the people of our culture?
- According to verses 20–24, how are the lives of believers supposed to be different?
- What is the solution to darkened understanding, ignorance, and callousness?
- What is God's role in transforming us? What is our role?

Read Ephesians 4:25-32

This section is filled with practical commands on how we relate with each other.

- 25 Why is truth-telling so crucial for a body of believers?
- 26-27 What do we learn about properly managing anger? How can anger become an opportunity for the devil?
- **28** What does a "thief" look like in our culture? What does this teach us about the point of work?
- **29** What does this teach us about our speech? How might corrupted speech ruin a body of believers?
- **30** Why would the sinful actions described in this passage grieve the Holy Spirit? How are they contrary to our new nature?
- 31- What are the keys to putting away these aspects of hatred toward others?
- 32 Why is God's forgiveness toward you critical in your kindness toward others?

Application

- In what ways have you put off your old self since becoming a believer?
- What has been most helpful to you in putting on your new self? What has God used to transform your thinking?
- Consider the practical commands in this section. Which ones would you like to see God transform in your life?
- Who do you know who is darkened, ignorant, and callous? Take time to pray for the people in your lives who need to be awakened by the knowledge of Jesus.
